# **NEWSLETTER No: 3 Spring Term 2022**



A somewhat belated Happy New Year. It's so hard to believe it's now 2022 and we have been dealing with the impact of COVID19 for nearly two years! We hope you enjoyed a fabulous festive break and it has been great to welcome back all our pupils at the start of the Spring Term. As is usual here at TCJA, we have lots planned and we are keeping everything crossed that we remain fully open over the coming term.

**COVID-19** As you know, Covid-19 is still making life difficult for us all.

Thank you to all parents/carers for your on-going support with taking your children for PCR tests if they have <u>any</u> of the following symptoms:

Continuous cough
High temperature or
Loss/change of smell/taste

Lateral flow tests are only to be used when the person does not have the above symptoms.

# NEW GUIDANCE - removal of confirmatory PCR tests

Anyone, including staff and pupils, who receives a positive lateral flow test but has no COVID-19 symptoms will no longer have to take a PCR to confirm the result. This is a temporary measure while COVID-19 rates remain high across the UK. Whilst levels of COVID-19 are high, the vast majority of people with positive LFD results can be confident that they have COVID. This is effective from Tuesday 11 January.

## SEEDS TO SUCCESS - message from Mrs Hunter

Thank you for your continued support with helping your child to achieve their 'Seeds to Success'. Your child is making a difference to their own lives and the lives of others. The seeds are tasks that your child completes at home and at school. There is a copy of the seeds in your child's personal organiser so that you can see which seed your child would like to complete. ## **Y6 BOOSTERS/SATS MEETING**

#### **ONLINE SAFETY**

EE have partnered with child experts and charities to create the PhoneSmart Licence

This is a fun, interactive and educational course which helps children and young people learn how to stay safe and be kind online, and encourages them to use their phones for good, not hate.

The PhoneSmart course is split into five episodes, where children and young people can follow four engaging young characters as they get their first phones and embark on their online adventures. Each episode covers key aspects of online behaviour, from cyberbullying to fake news and has fun quizzes, interactive elements, and pop-up facts to help children and young people learn vital online do's and don't's.

PhoneSmart has been created for children, aged 10-13, who have just received their first smartphone. It's also a tool for parents and guardians to help gauge their child's readiness for the responsibilities of smartphone ownership, as well as helping to start the bigger conversations about the risks they might face online.

## **ATTENDANCE UPDATES – INCLUDING REWARDS**

During this half term we see an increase in sickness absence. Please don't forget to phone in first thing in the morning if your child is not coming to school. If you're unsure whether or not your child is fit to come in, please try sending them, unless they have COVID symptoms as previously outlined. We will contact you if they become worse and it's possible that the distraction of being in their class will help!

Our attendance & punctuality rewards continue:-

## Punctuality reward (weekly)

Pupils' names, of those who are in school on-time every day, go into a weekly draw, drawn on Monday morning - 3 winners receive a certificate. At the end of the year, all children previously entered into one of the weekly draws will go into a **BIG** draw - 5 names will be drawn, each winning a £10 shopping voucher.

# **Best Class attendance (weekly)**

The winning class is announced at our Monday assembly. They have an extra 15 minute break time or a 15 minute activity of their choice. They also get to keep our attendance mascot for the week.

## **Attendance Reward**

The qualifying period for this reward is 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021 – 27<sup>th</sup> May 2022 and your child will need to achieve **97%+** attendance to be included. Term time holidays, medical appointments and illness are still 'absences' and will affect your child's attendance percentage. During June/early July, qualifying pupils will be offered the opportunity to attend an adventurous outdoor activity. This will be a session at somewhere like the Mill Base or Colwick Park Adventure Centres. More details will follow when we know who has qualified!
