NEWSLETTER No 4 Spring Term 2022



So far, this half-term is going well. School feels much more normal with many plans being made and kept, such as our football teams resuming matches and plans for fund raising events such as Red Nose Day-who can remember buying red noses, but not being able to wear them last year! Far fewer children have been affected by Covid since returning from the last half-term holiday, although I want to reassure you that we are keeping good hygiene practices in place and sending children with symptoms home for PCR tests. Should numbers rise again, like they did before the February half-term, I will let you know and reintroduce measures but we do seem to be over the worst of it, so fingers crossed.

COVID-19 - New guidance

There is a link on our website to further, more detailed guidance but in summary - if your child has any of the following symptoms, please do not send them in to school. Call us and let us know, and book a PCR test by calling 119 or through the online service.

- Continuous cough
- High temperature or
- Loss/change of smell/taste

It is still recommended that pupils with confirmed PCR tests stay at home and isolate. They may be infectious for up to 10 days. They should take a LFD test from day 5 after their symptoms started (or positive test day if no symptoms), followed by another test the next day. If the two tests are negative, they are well enough to do so and they no longer have a temperature, they can return to school.

As usual, should you be unsure about what to do, just give the office a call and we can help.

SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE

By wearing yellow and blue, we raised £245 in support for families in Ukraine - thank you for your generosity at this time of economic hardship and uncertainty for all of us. As usual, we are supporting children to understand what is happening in the world and helping them to feel safe. If you feel your child needs any extra help with this, please don't hesitate to contact the teachers. Also, if your family are struggling to make ends meet or for any other reasons, remember we are here to help, so please get in touch with us.

FRIDAY AWARDS ASSEMBLY

We are pleased to once again invite parents to Friday assemblies. The next one will be on 25th March: Years 5/6 will be at 9.00-10am, and Years 3/4 at 2.00-3pm. With Mothers' Day on Sunday 27th March, this assembly will be themed 'Thanks for all you do' with an opportunity for your child to give cards to carers/parents who attend. After the assembly, your children will be serving cakes and tea/coffee on this occasion as an extra thank you for all you do. More details to follow.

ONLINE SAFETY

The number of complaints we are receiving about children's activity online has increased. This is very concerning, particularly as it is a large part of the learning all children do at school. We have advised a number of parents to report incidents to CEOPS and the police, who take the issues seriously and have spoken to parents/carers about their children's behaviour and safety online. Please ensure that children are not accessing apps and games that are above their age range such as WhatsApp (12), or TikTok (12).

Children should not be bringing mobile phones or smart watches into school.

PARKING

Again we have received more complaints about parking in and around Foxhill Road, the treatment of Crossing Patrol staff and parental conflict over parking and blocking roads. Please be considerate to our local residents, to Mrs Walker, and to each other. Please DO NOT BLOCK ANY DRIVEWAYS, even for two minutes parking on a dropped kerb is an offence, and can result in a fine and penalty. Also do not park on the hatched lines near the crossing - again, this is an offence, and is dangerous for children using the crossing, as it obstructs drivers' views.

We direct anyone who contacts us to report incidents to the police, backed up with photographic evidence if they have it. Notts County Council do have mobile units that monitor known problem areas - and they do have the power to fine offenders.
