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Attendance continues to be a great concern and we need to improve! As you know we have very high targets for our attendance and we would really like to see attendance levels around 98% if we can. We really notice how pupils who have attendance lower than 90% struggle to meet their end of year expected outcomes in all year groups. Every day really counts so let's see if we can smash the next few weeks, as we run up to Christmas, by getting pupils into their classrooms every day - we can do it!

ACADEMY IMPROVEMENT

The following priorities have been identified in our 2023-24 Academy Improvement Plan:-

- Further improve outcomes for higher attaining pupils in all year groups.
- Further develop the reading strategy to accelerate reading ages for all pupils in line with DfE Guidance.
- Further develop outcomes in writing.
- Develop the approach to the delivery of handball as part of cocurriculum offer, in line with the Trust.
- Integrate the routine and effective use of iPads into teaching strategy
- Further develop strategies to reduce the absence of all pupils whose attendance is below national average.
- Continue to embed The Redhill Academy Trust's Equality Diversity and Inclusion objectives.

INSPIRING LEADERS

As you may know, we have four children who are 'Inspiring Leaders' in our school. They are leading a different focus each term. This term's focus is 'Save Paper'.

They are encouraging all the children to save paper in our academy and our local community. This makes us be more conscious about sustainability. So far, we are very pleased with all the children and adults in school, but I'm sure we can think of more ways to save paper!

ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

The children wore odd socks and enjoyed watching a live lesson based on 'Speaking Out'. We encourage all our children to report bullying if it happens and to thoroughly understand what bullying is and how it can affect people. We revisit this topic several times over the year in PSHRE and computing lessons.

CHILDREN IN NEED

Our thanks to everyone for supporting this annual charity event. We raised £365.54 through the non-uniform event and selling merchandise.

Like many schools, we continue to follow the Jigsaw Scheme and have found it a very successful in supporting our lessons over the years. We also use Picture News each week, to discuss a wide number of issues with children. This is based on a simple question and enables all children to take part in discussions.
